## President's Column

I confess, although I feel both honoured and humbled to be the Society's President, I have greatly enjoyed serving as Honorary Secretary both the Society and two outstanding Presidents but I did not anticipate finding myself the Society's President!

My predecessor, Professor Herwig Imhof, has set an impressive standard to which I must aspire. Herwig Imhof led the Society with enthusiasm, energy and wisdom. At our annual general meeting in Oxford in October he described the Society's initiatives in which he had been involved and I can think of no better tribute to his term of office than to summarise them here.

Firstly, we established an Education Subcommittee under the chairmanship of Dr Minerva Becker. This has led to a rolling three-year cycle of refresher courses and the Society has contributed to the new European guidelines for general and speciality training. These need regular review and we now have formal representation in this process, giving the Society an important role in determining educational standards in head and neck radiology.

Secondly, the annual scientific meeting is the most important avenue for maintaining contact with members. The scientific content of recent meetings has been outstanding and gives the Society a good base for further development.

Thirdly the annual scientific meeting offers an opportunity for international exchange. One of the original objectives of ESHNR was a joint meeting every three years with our

American counterpart ASHNR. Changing circumstances since both societies were founded has made this difficult to achieve in recent years (but discussions continue; watch this space!). However joint and international meetings are desirable and for the 2006 meeting in Budapest the Society will be collaborating with the Asian and Oceanic Society.

Fourth, the Society has enhanced relationships with the European Congress, advising on speakers and content of the annual refresher courses. The current plans to merge ECR and EAR offer changes in which the input of the Society has been recognised and needs to continue through the period of change. The Society has appointed representatives on EAR committees (listed elsewhere in this Newsletter).

Fifth, one of the Society's roles is to stimulate scientific work and publication in head and neck imaging. We have continued to use European Radiology as the official journal but there have been recent explorations of collaboration with ESNR and their journal, Neuroradiology.

Last but certainly not least, among Professor Imhof's initiatives has been this Newsletter itself, as a means of developing contact with the membership. The Society website has also been founded and although it still requires a little work, has tremendous potential for future value.

All in all, Professor Imhof's term of office has been a distinguished time for the Society and he has thrown down the gauntlet to the new Executive Committee to develop these initia-



tives in a similarly energetic manner. It is, naturally, a source of some comfort to me that our regulations require him to remain on the Executive for a further three years as Past President, providing us with a source of experience and wise counsel!

When I joined ESHNR I found that the Society was not so large that it was possible to achieve something of the nature of a visiting club, particularly at the annual meeting. I have greatly enjoyed my contact with members as Secretary and I am looking forward, with the support of the new Executive Committee (membership listed below) to working with you all to further our Society's fortunes.

Finally, above all remember this! This is YOUR Newsletter and one of the main channels in which you can express yourself within the Society. When I hand over the direction of the Society in three years' time I would very much like there to be an active correspondence column, together with news coming in regularly from members. So, get your pens and paper out and let us know your views!

## Lifetime Achievement Award to Dr Glyn Lloyd

The Society is delighted to announce that Dr Glyn A S Lloyd received the Lifetime Achievement Award at the 2005 annual meeting.

Dr Lloyd graduated in 1946 and trained in radiology at the London and St Bartholomew's Hospitals, becoming consultant radiologist to Chelsea and Kensington Hospitals and then consultant radiologist at Moorfields Eye Hospital.

In 1967 he was appointed Director of Radiology at the Royal National Throat Nose and Ear Hospital and in 1973 was awarded the degree of Doctor of Medicine. He has published extensively, being sole author of two textbooks and joint author of three others and produced over 120 papers on head and neck imaging. He received both the Barclay Prize and the Barclay Medal of the British Institute of Radiology and in 1984 was awarded jointly with Dr Peter Phelps the George Davey Howells Prize.

These are the bare facts of a career. What is more important is that for an entire generation Glyn Lloyd was one of the leaders of head and neck imaging in the UK and many now working in the field can attribute this to his example, inspiration and encouragement. He had a long lasting and fruitful collaboration with the late Dr Peter Phelps (Congress President in 1996) and it is difficult to go far in the UK literature without coming across the names of Lloyd and Phelps. In 2001 they were both awarded Honorary Membership of the Society.

Glyn Lloyd was one of two UK representatives who met at the invitation of Professor Hermann Willbrand in 1987 to consider founding the Society and he has remained an enthusiastic and energetic supporter of the Society since then.

It is particularly pleasing that the Society made this award at the 2005 meeting in Oxford because Dr Lloyd is a graduate of Oxford, having entered University College and trained in clinical medicine at the Radcliffe Infirmary. The Executive Committee are very pleased to offer Dr Lloyd their congratulations in this well-deserved award.
